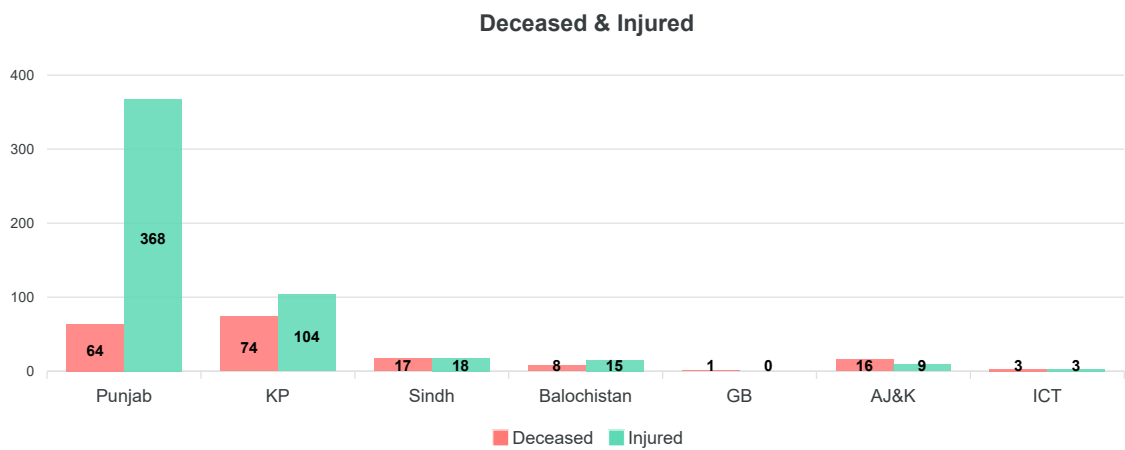

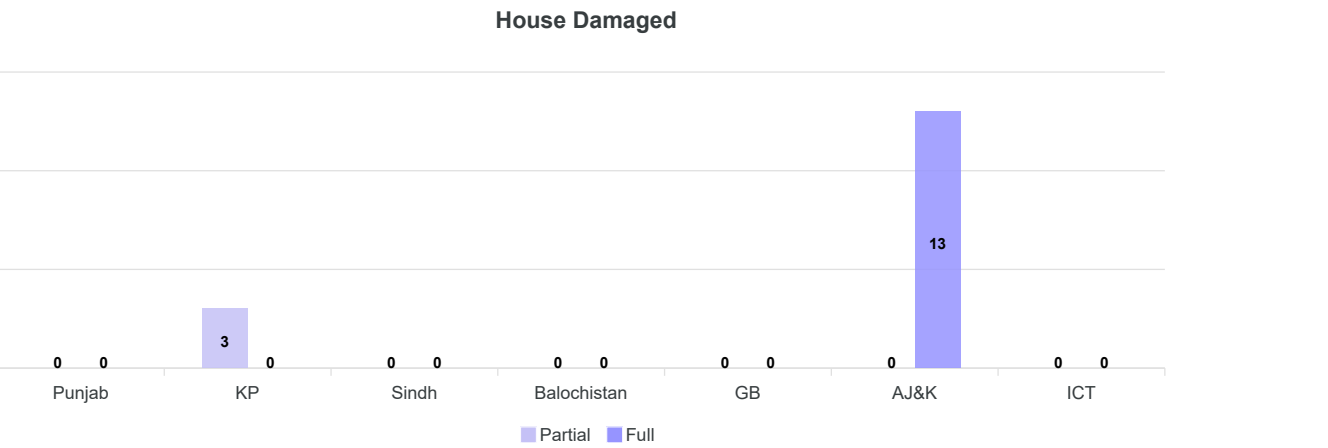

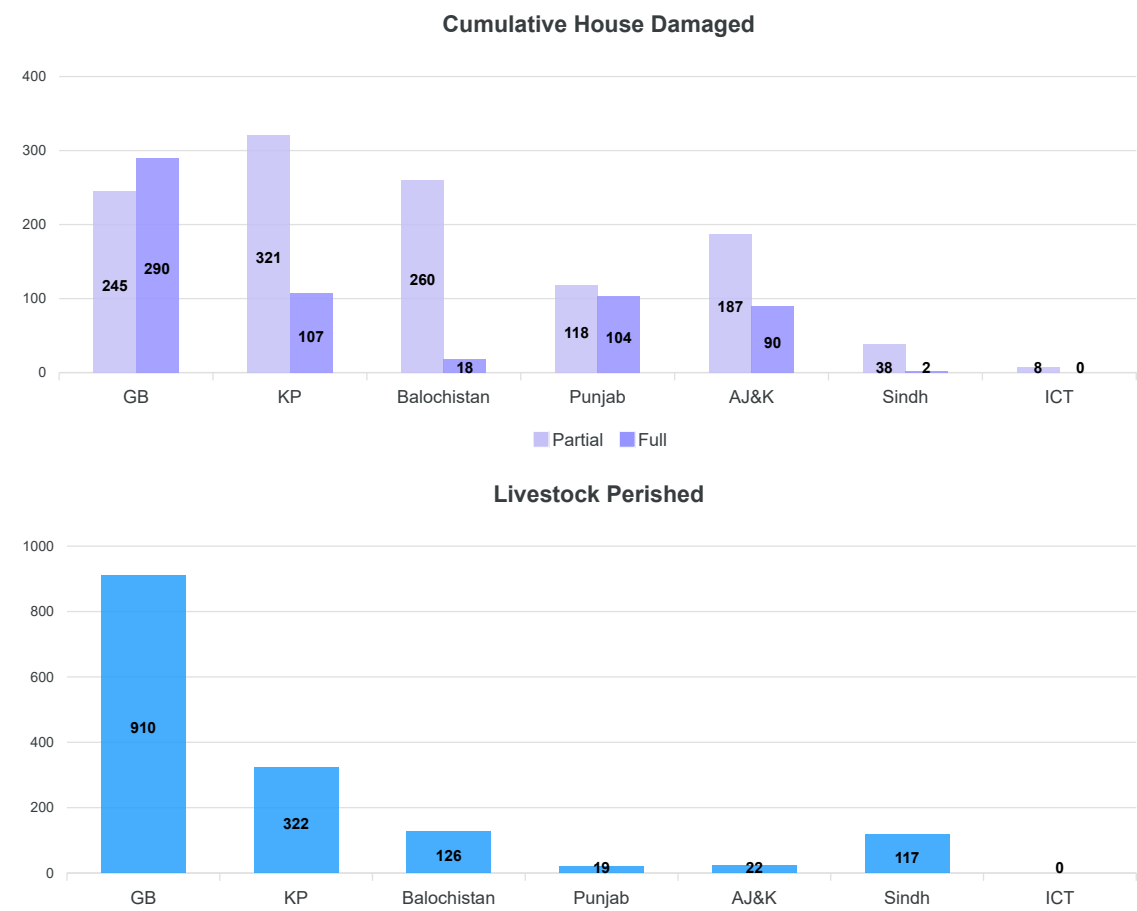

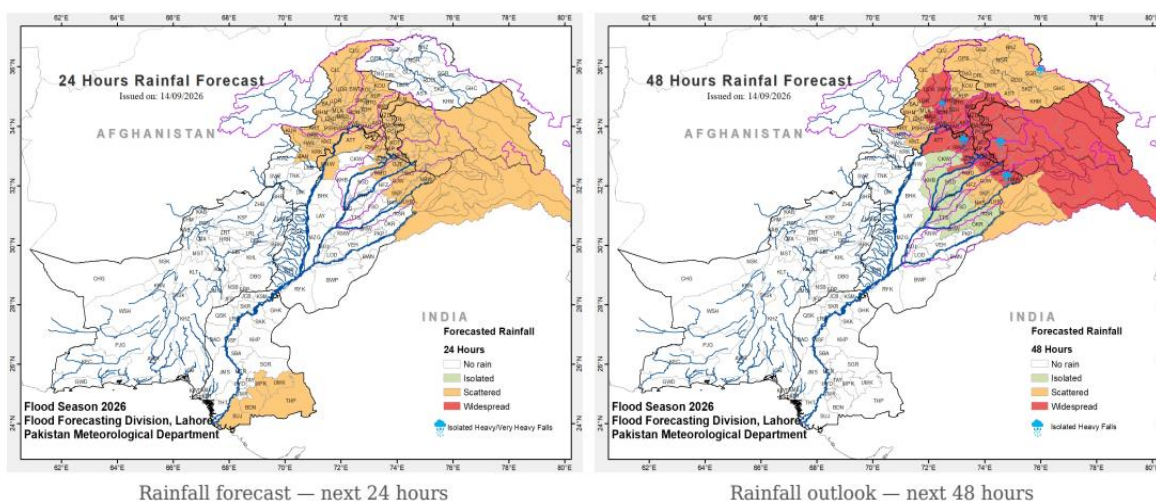

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A shallow trough of westerly wave still persists over the northeastern parts of the country.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over north of Maharashtra and adjoining areas of Madhya Pradesh, today lies over east Gujarat (India), and it is expected to weaken and move southwestwards.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over west Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Bay of Bengal are penetrating into the upper and south eastern parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls is expected over the catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir, Southeastern Sindh, Gilgit-Baltistan and upper Punjab during next 48-hours.**

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- All major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at all gauging stations.
