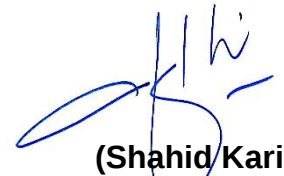

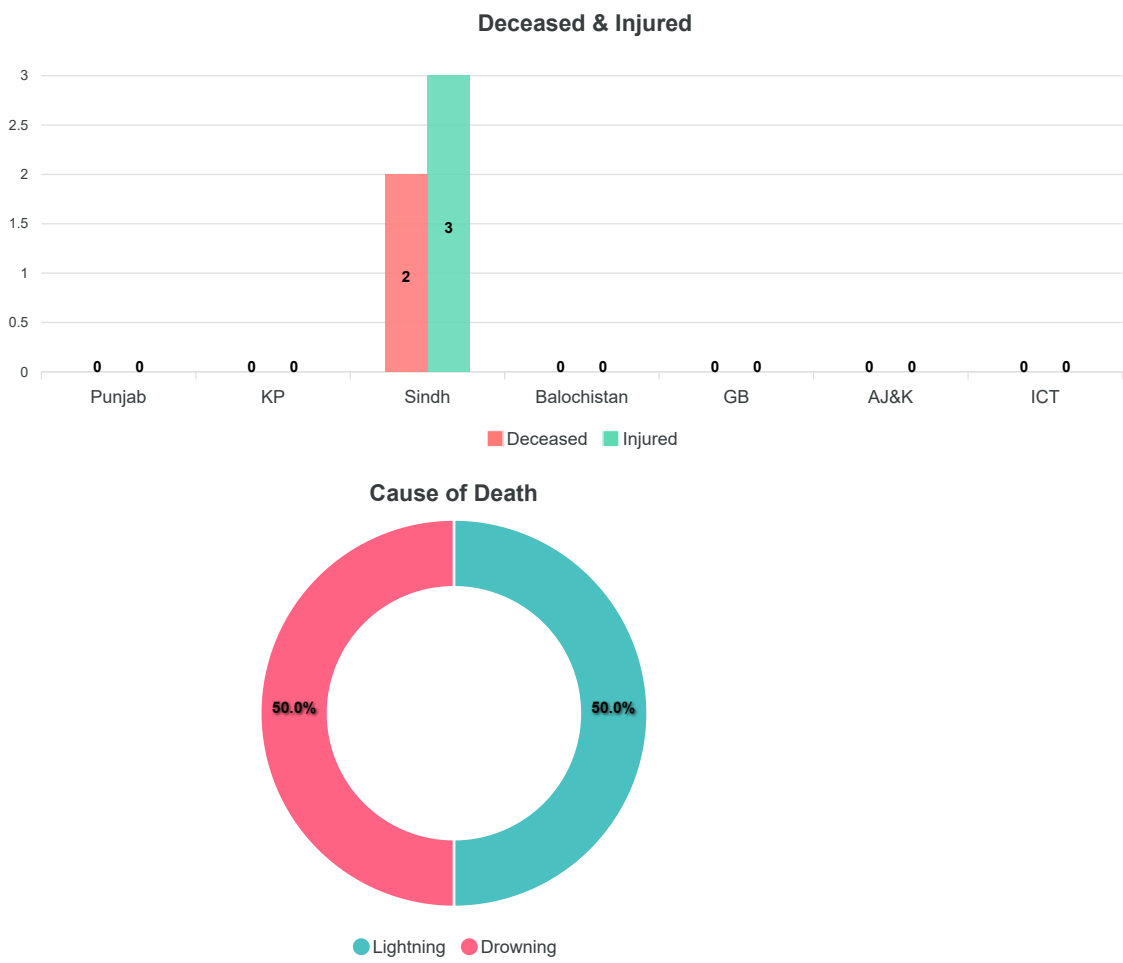

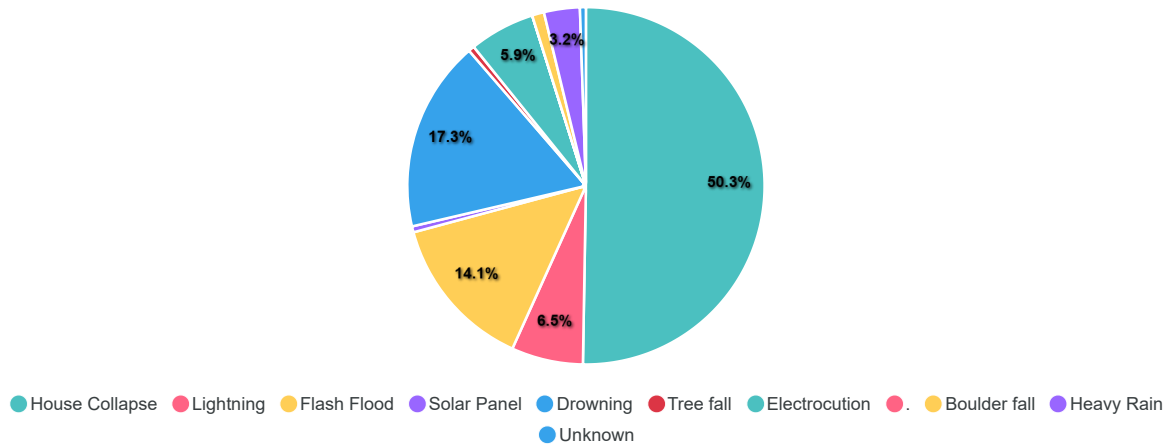

Deceased & Injured



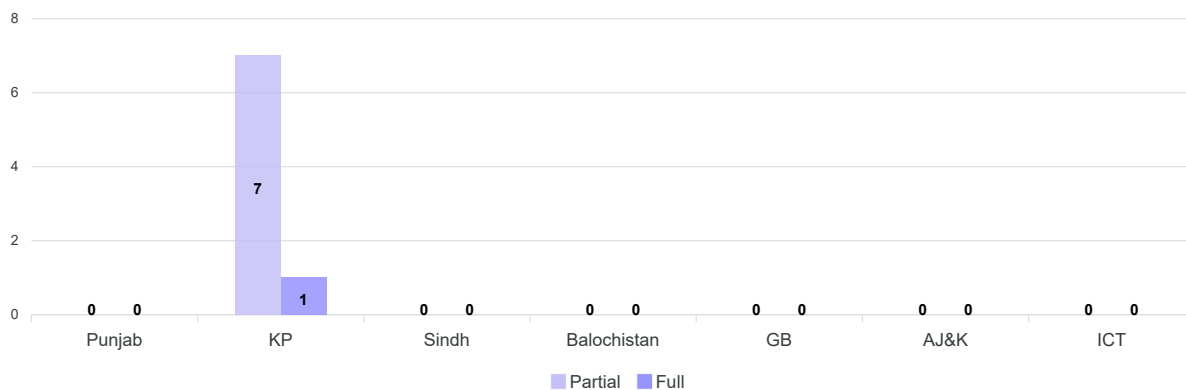
Causes of Death



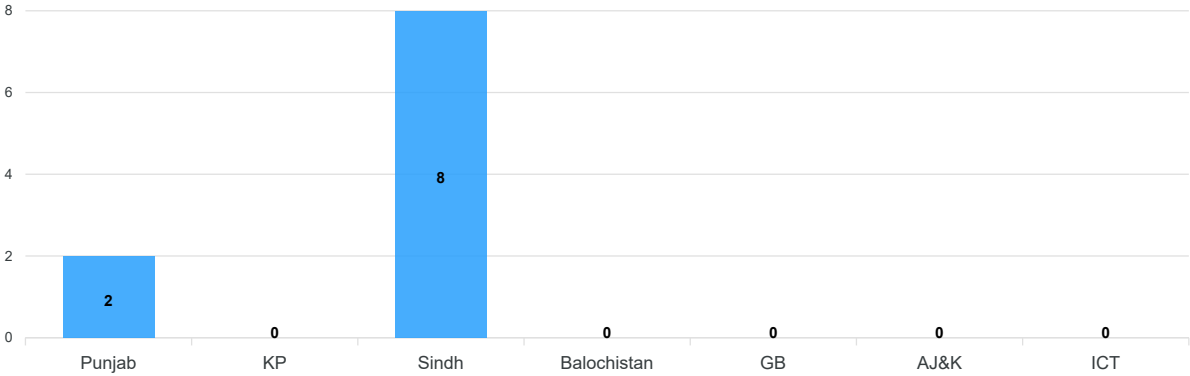

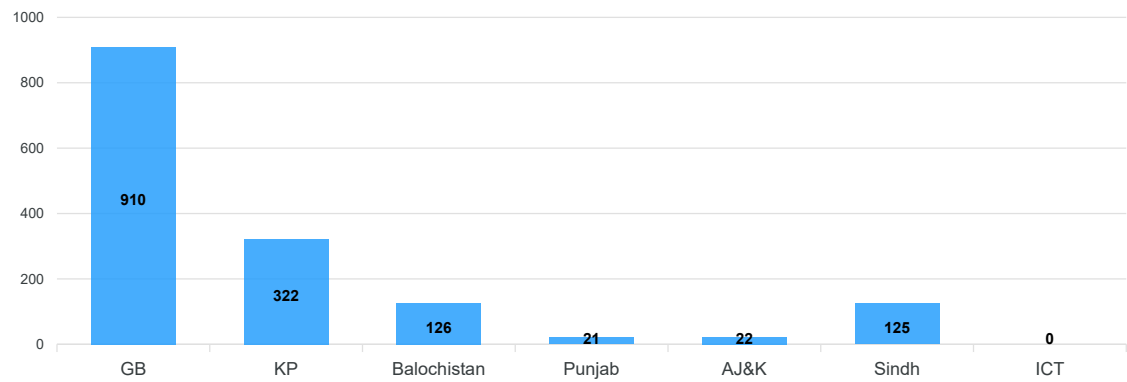

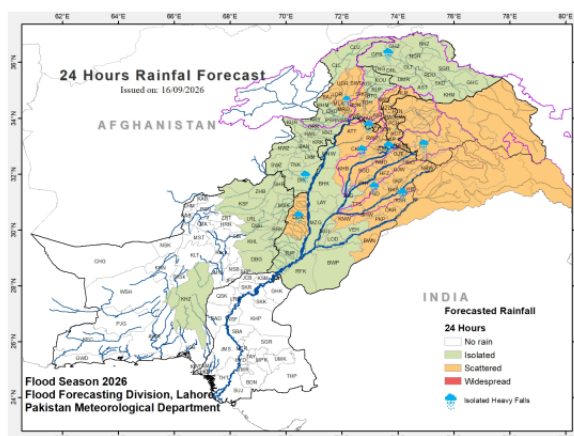

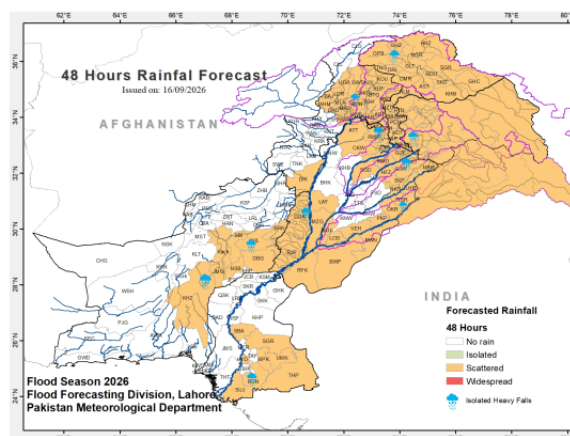

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A trough of westerly wave lies over the northwestern parts of the country.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over west Gujarat (India) and adjoining southeast Sindh, today lies in Arabian Sea along coast of Gujarat and it is expected to weaken further during next 24 to 36-hours.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over west Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian Sea are penetrating into the upper and central parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm with isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir, eastern Balochistan, Gilgit-Baltistan and Punjab** during next **36-hours**.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- All major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at all gauging stations.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Flows in all major rivers are expected to remain within the normal flow range at their respective rim stations.
- **Flash Flooding is expected in the nullahs of DG Khan, Rajanpur and eastern Balochistan, during the next 36 hours.**

WEEKLY SIGNIFICANT OUTLOOK

I. RAINFALL OUTLOOK

- Due to the Prevailing **westerly weather system** coupled with moist currents from **Arabian Sea**, **Scattered to Widespread rain-wind/thunderstorm** with **isolated heavy falls** is expected over the **upper catchments of all the major rivers, Kashmir, Gilgit-Baltistan, Punjab, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and east Balochistan till 18th September.**

II. FLOOD OUTLOOK

- Flows in all major rivers along with their associated nullahs are expected to increase slightly during the period.
