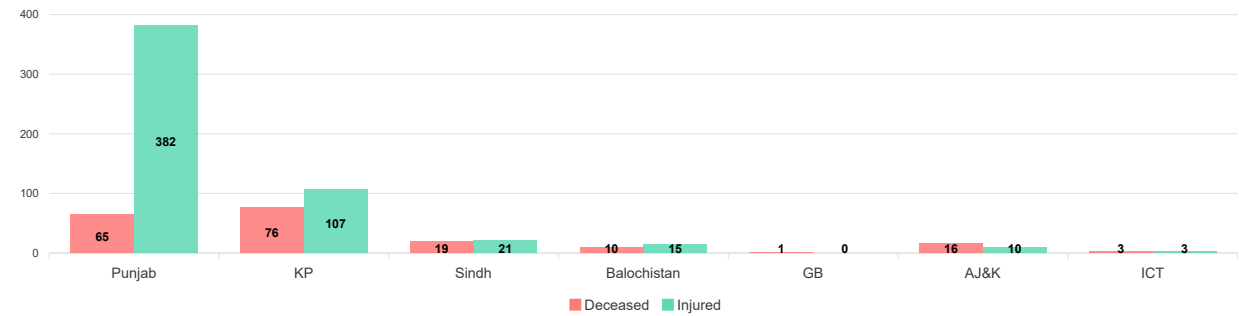

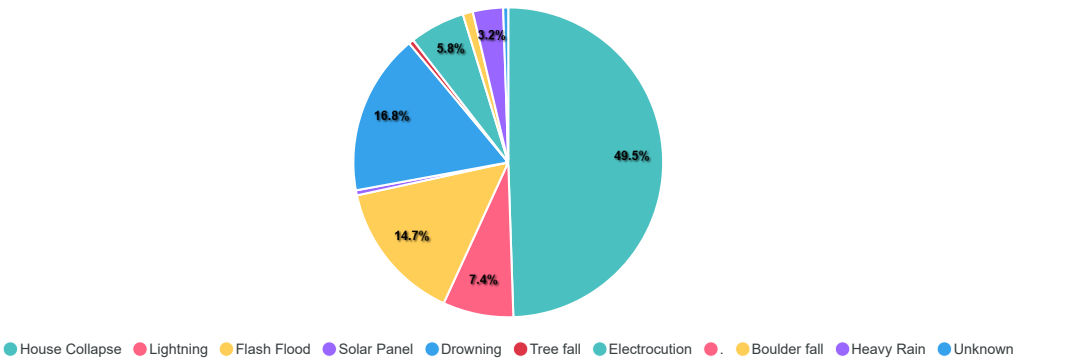

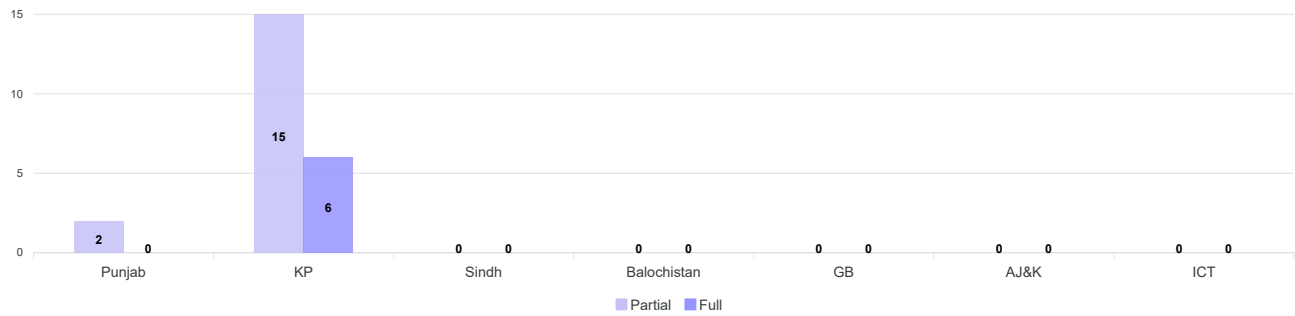

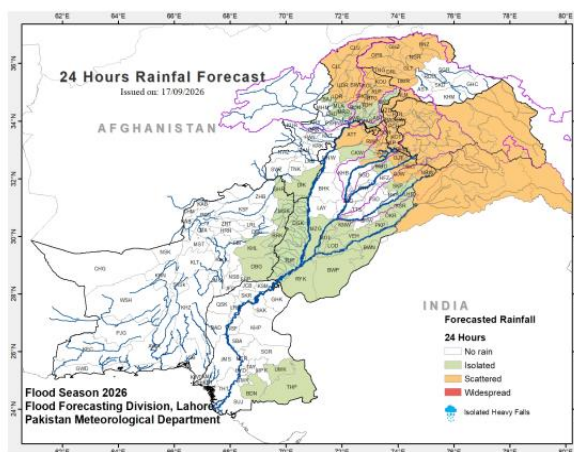

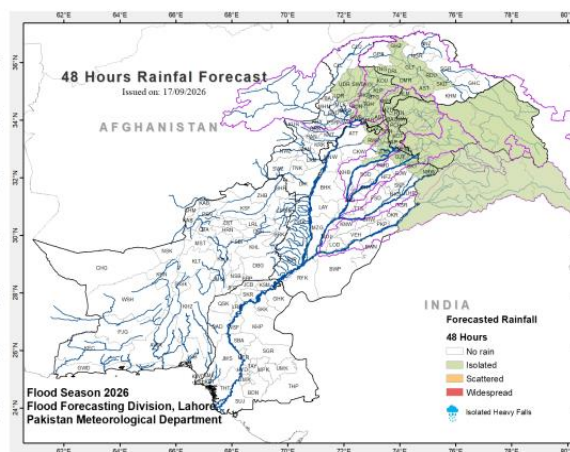

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A trough of westerly wave lies over the central and upper parts of the country.
- Yesterday's low pressure system over Arabian Sea along coast of Gujarat has dissipated and become insignificant.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over west Balochistan.
- Moderate moist currents from Arabian Sea are penetrating into the upper and central parts of the country up to 3,000 feet.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- **Scattered rain-wind/thunderstorm** is expected over the **catchments of all the major rivers, Islamabad, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Kashmir, eastern Balochistan, Gilgit-Baltistan and Punjab** during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- All major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at all gauging stations.
