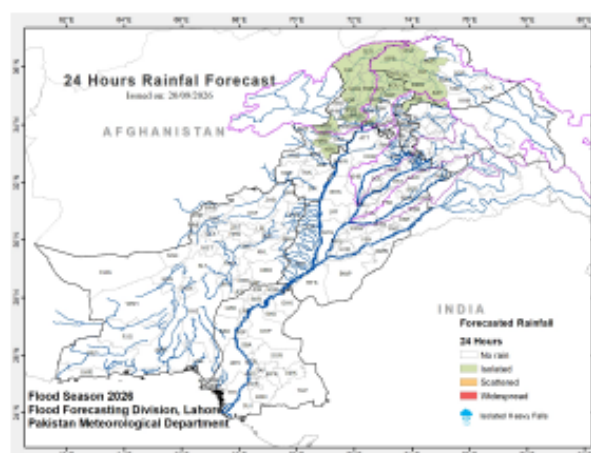

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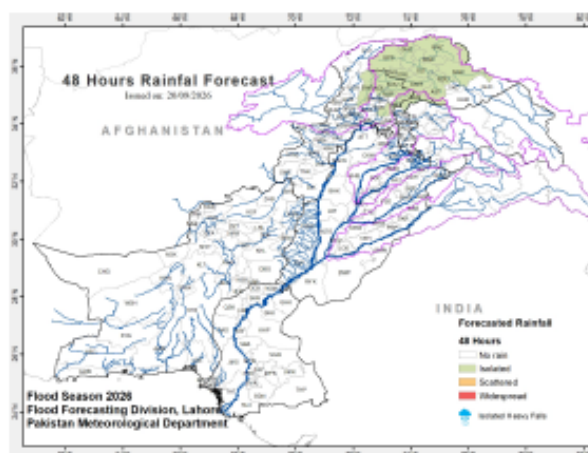

RIVERS SITUATION AND QUALITATIVE FLOOD FORECAST

I. METEOROLOGICAL FEATURES

- A weak trough of westerly wave lies over upper parts of the country.
- Seasonal low-pressure area lies over west Balochistan.
- Moist currents from Arabian Sea are temporarily cut-off.

II. METEOROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Mainly dry weather is expected over most parts of the country, however, Isolated thunderstorm/rain is expected over the upper catchments of river Indus, upper Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, some parts of Kashmir & Gilgit-Baltistan during next 24-hours.

III. HYDROLOGICAL SITUATION at 0600 PST

- All major rivers are flowing in their normal flows at all gauging stations.

IV. HYDROLOGICAL OUTLOOK

- Flows in all major rivers are expected to remain within the normal flow range at their respective rim stations.



V. WEATHER FORECAST FOR 24-HOURS
