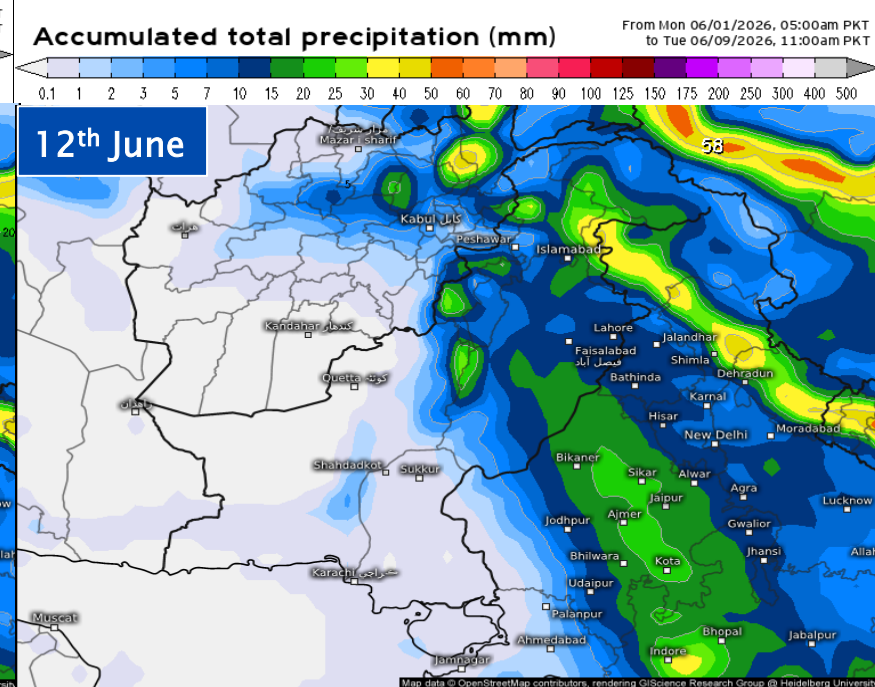
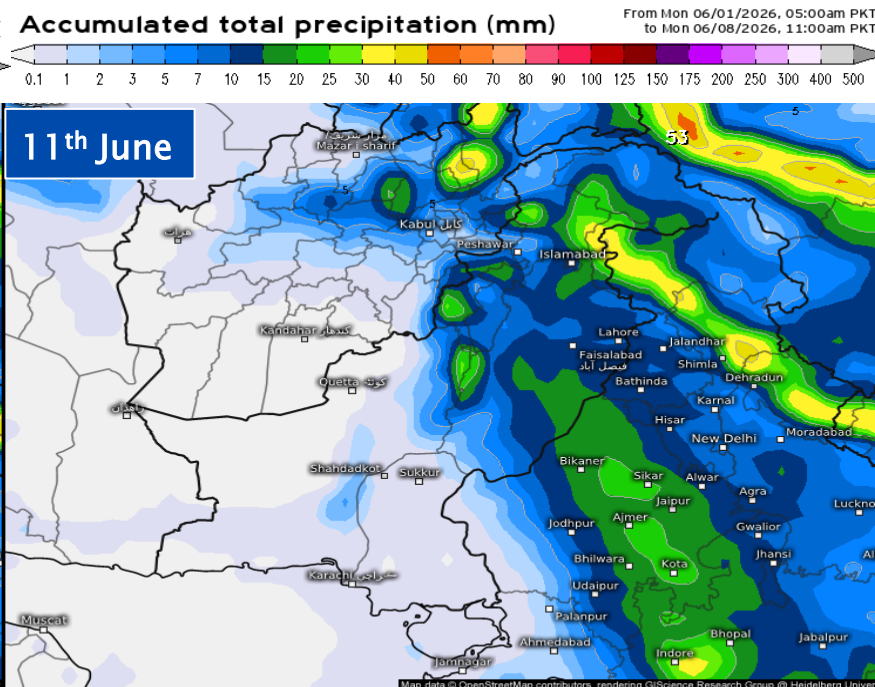
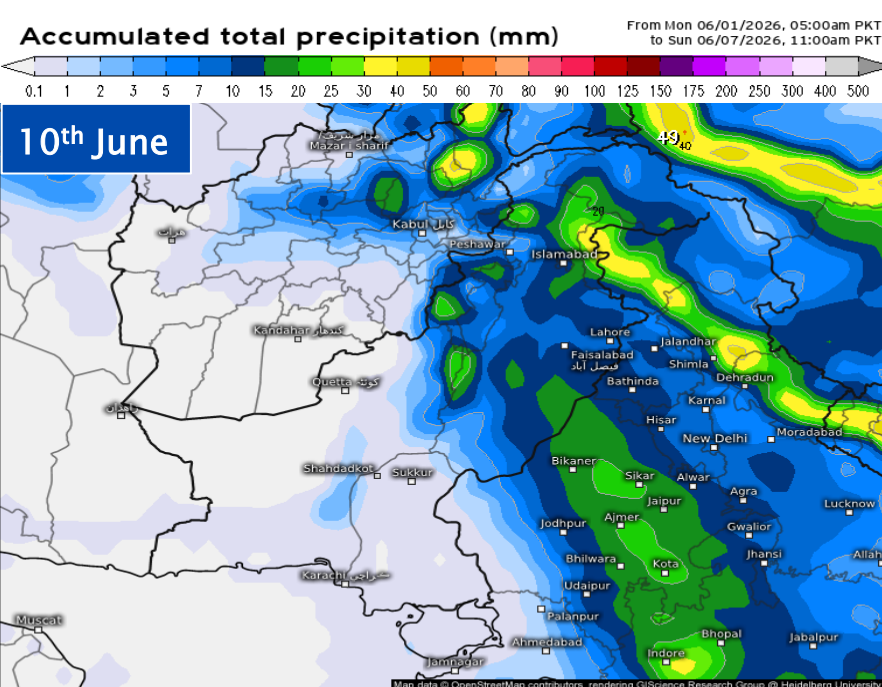
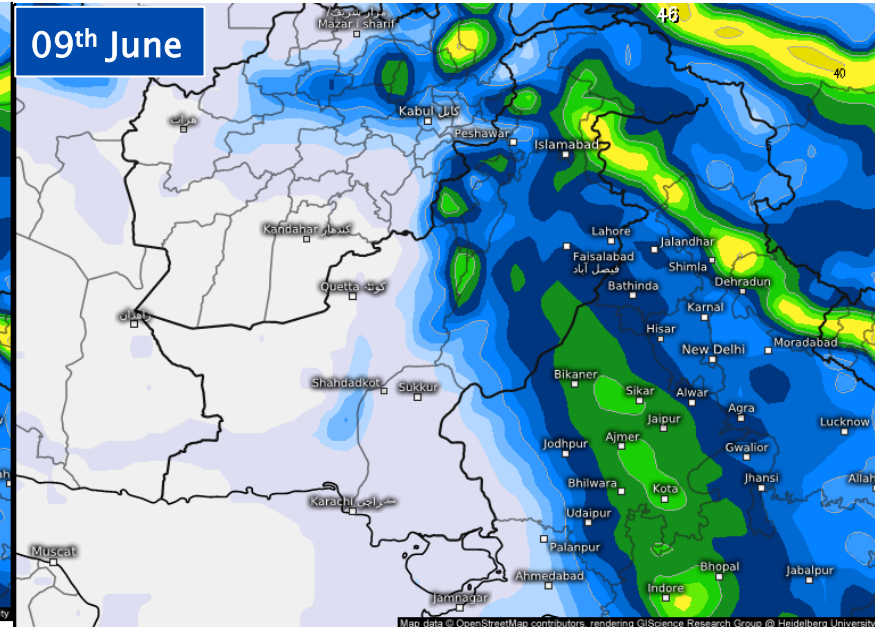
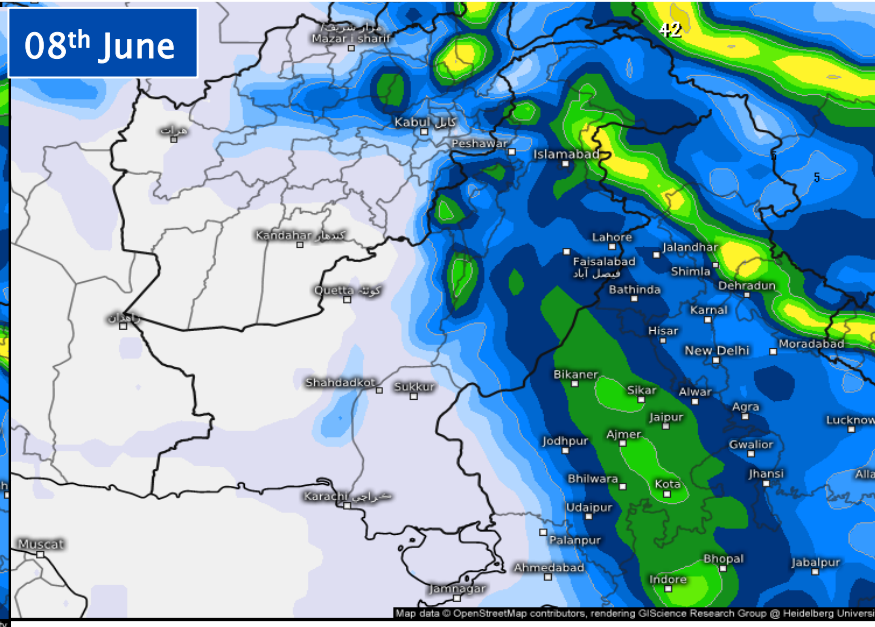
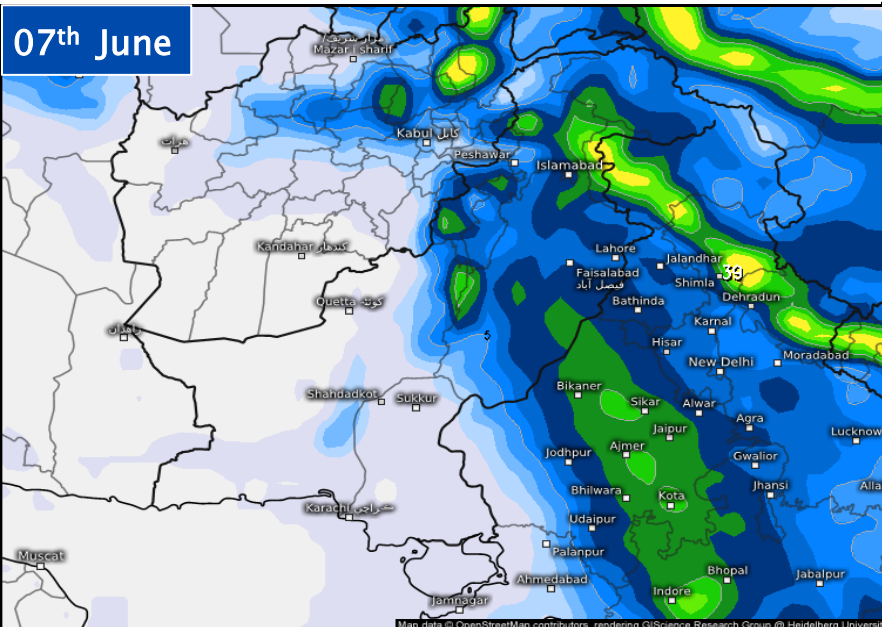




Weather Advisory (07th June to 12th June, 2026)

Country is likely to remain under the influence of hot and dry continental air, with above-normal temperatures over Sindh, southern Punjab, and much of Balochistan. A weak westerly wave and localized moisture may trigger isolated rain-thunderstorms over upper KP, Islamabad, northern Punjab, GB, and AJK during 07–10 June. Rainfall activity is expected to decrease after 10 June, with temperatures gradually increasing across most regions.

Punjab:

Predominantly hot conditions will prevail across Punjab, with maximum temperatures generally above normal over central and southern districts. Isolated to scattered rain-thunderstorms during 07–10 June may occur over Rawalpindi, Attock, Chakwal, Jhelum, Gujrat, Gujranwala, Sialkot, Lahore, and nearby areas. Occasional gusty winds are possible. Southern Punjab is expected to remain largely dry and hot.

Sindh:

Predominantly hot and dry weather is expected across Sindh during 07–12 June, including Karachi, Hyderabad, Sukkur, Larkana, Mirpurkhas, and Tharparkar. Isolated cloud development may occur over northern Sindh region.

Balochistan:

Most districts of Balochistan are expected to remain under the influence of hot and dry continental air. However, isolated rain-thunderstorms may develop during 07–09 June over northeastern districts including Zhob, Musakhel and adjoining areas due to weak upper-level disturbances. Temperatures are likely to remain above normal across central and southern Balochistan, with heat stress conditions persisting in lowland districts.

KP:

Warm continental air is expected to dominate most parts of KP; however, a weak westerly wave and localized moisture may trigger isolated to scattered rain-thunderstorms during 07–10 June over Chitral, Dir, Swat, Malakand, Kohistan, Mansehra, Abbottabad, Peshawar, and adjoining areas. Temperatures are likely to remain near normal in upper districts, while warmer and drier conditions are expected across most areas during 11–12 June.

GB & AJK:

A weak westerly pattern and persistent moisture availability may produce scattered to widespread rain-thunderstorms during 07–12 June over GB and AJK. Localized moderate to heavy rain falls and gusty winds are possible over higher elevations. Temperatures are expected to remain below normal due to cloud cover and precipitation.
