




HEATWAVE

Advisory: March to July 2026



PROJECTION

From April 2026 onward, Pakistan is expected to experience above-normal temperatures, with an early onset of heatwave conditions likely by late April across central and southern Punjab, Sindh, and parts of Balochistan.



Persistently high maximum daily temperatures are expected to trigger the heatwave, which intensify during May and June with temperatures exceeding above normal temperature, while elevated heat stress could continue till July in the most affected areas.

PUNJAB

SINDH

Dadu, Badin, Larkana, Karachi, Sukkur, Jafarabad, Tharparkar, Khairpur, Jacobabad, Jamshoro, Naushahro Feroze, Thatta and neighboring localities

BALUCHISTAN

Dera Bugti, Sibbi, Dera Jamali, Lasbela, Khuzdar and neighboring localities
