


Severe Weather System across Southern & Eastern United States



Valid: From January 22, 2026 (intensification begins) to January 27, 2026 (gradual weakening thereafter).

Affected Areas

Southern and southeastern United States, including Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, extending northeast into the Mid-Atlantic and Northeast, affecting Florida, the Carolinas, New York, New Jersey, and New England coastal regions.

Hazard Types

Heavy Rainfall, Thunderstorms, Flash & Urban Flooding, Coastal Flooding.

Hazard Summary

The weather system is developing over the Gulf of Mexico and moving northeastward across the United States, drawing in abundant moisture and strengthening as it advances. The system is expected to produce widespread heavy rainfall, thunderstorms, and strong winds across the southern states, followed by increasing impacts along the East Coast and Northeast, including urban and coastal areas. These conditions elevate the risk of flash flooding, coastal flooding, travel disruption, and power outages, particularly in low-lying and densely populated regions.
